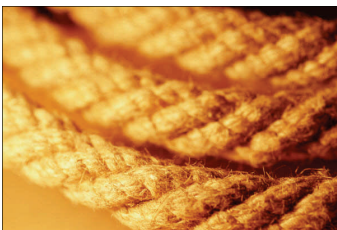

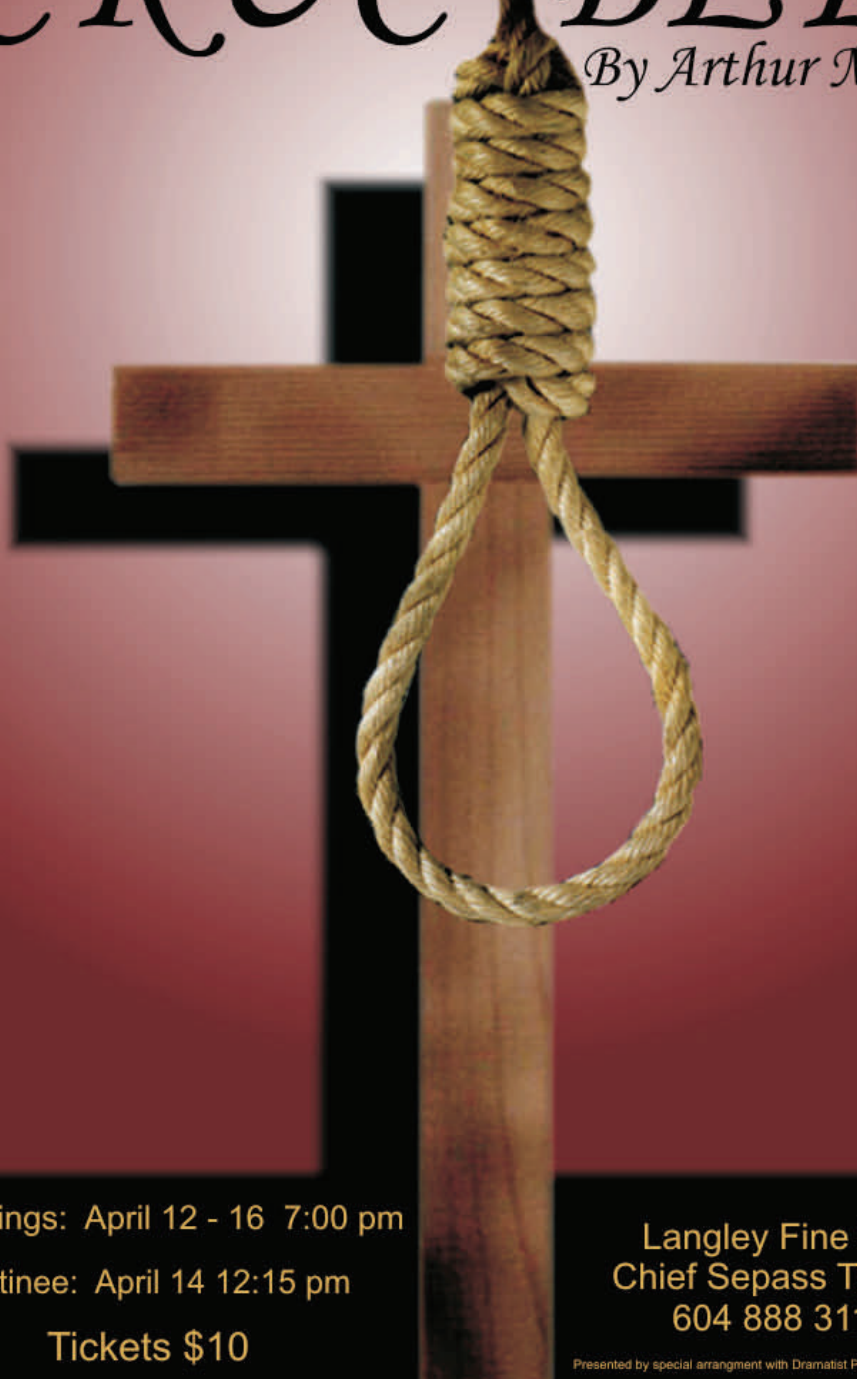

NON GRAD STATUS POSITION

as of report card day April 19th 2011:

If a grade 12 student is trailing a grade 10 or 11 compulsory course, failing a grade 12 course*, or missing an elective credit, then they are in a NON GRAD STATUS POSITION

If a grade 12 student is taking a compulsory course or an essential elective course on line and has less than half completed successfully then they are in a NON GRAD STATUS POSITION*

- *If you have passed over 50% of the course by June 1st then your name will appear on the commencement / dinner dance programs. After that if you reach the above amount then you can attend both but your name will not appear on the program. It is up to you, the student, to provide the evidence from their online school or teacher. Ms De Little will not be chasing it or you.*

If you are in a NON GRAD STATUS POSITION then crossing the stage at commencement and attending the Newlands prom as a student or guest will be placed in jeopardy. You will not be permitted to purchase tickets for either event while in a NON GRAD STATUS POSITION.
